The School Sport Premium is funded jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. We are required to spend this additional funding on healthy lifestyle and PE provision.

Badu Sports co-ordinates the development of sport in most Hackney schools. It provides staff training and support and ensures that children get excellent opportunities to participate in sport and exercise both in school and through extra-curricular activities.

Our partnership with Badu Sports continues to be a great success. Across the school including the Foundation Stage, K.S.1 and K.S.2 the children have had opportunities to engage in PE lessons led by professional coaches. The coaches not only bring their expertise, they also come with excellent up to date sporting equipment. The range of sports provided this year includes cricket, invasion games, football, cycling, athletics and gymnastics. After school sports club provision has also benefited and included football, multi-sports and dance.

Class teachers are able to observe and participate through team teaching with the coaches. This supports their professional development and enables them to continue providing excellent and engaging PE lessons.

During the summer term a number of our KS2 children took part in Race for Life and raised money for cancer research.

Being part of this partnership provides us with an opportunity to participate in a variety of competitions across a wide range of sports. So far this year, Thomas Fairchild has competed against other Hackney schools in cross athletics, football, athletics and cricket. The year 6 Girls were particularly successful in football reaching the Semi- final stages and then coming third overall.

The competitions have been a great opportunity for children who excel at sport. These children have the opportunity to be scouted and when identified, links can be made with local sporting clubs. Early identification enables parental participation and ensures that the child's talent is developed from an early age.
