Dear Families,

You will have received [our flyer](#) on 10th July about our **Summer Festival** event on Friday this week. I wanted to provide some further details about this exciting event.



Children should arrive at school at the usual time of 8.50am ready for the school day. Although it is a day of fun, children must still wear their usual school uniform.

During the day children will be taken to different workshops by their class teacher. These activities include: a flamenco workshop; yoga; arts and crafts; wheelchair basketball; poetry and rhyme; African drumming workshop; circus skills, and more!

From **3.20pm** all children will be dismissed from the **Forston street entrance** so that we can finish setting up for the party. Teachers will line up classes along the pavement outside the school so please collect children from their lining up spot. Nursery and Reception children will be collected from the inside door.

Once children have been collected, you are welcome to walk around to the Napier Grove entrance for our family event. Gates will open at around **3.40pm** and the event will run until **5.00pm**. Please see important reminders below regarding the family event.

- The event is **free** of charge and will include live music, food, workshops, games and a raffle!
- We would love families to donate food to the event. If you are able to donate some food, please let us know your contribution on the sign up sheet at the school office and gate.
- Children **must** be escorted by an adult to the party. Children without adults will not be allowed to join, including children from years 5 and 6.
- Due to the event, there will be no after school clubs. However, the playcentre will run as usual.
